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**German Doctor Advises Men to Take
a Lesson From Women.**

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PARIS, Sept. 5.—Short skirts, bare arms, low necks, bobbed hair and diaphanous garments have found a defender in Dr. Friedberger, who, in the *Munich Medical Review*, proclaims that women suffer much less from cold and have better health than men because of the lightness with which they are clad and the extent to which they expose their bodies to air and sunlight.

Men, he says, catch cold much more easily and are never so hardy and indifferent to change of temperature as modern women. He advocates knee length trousers, no waistcoats, no collars or ties and lightweight suits as a cure for all masculine ailment.
