

HIGH HEELS PROHIBITED BY PROPOSED UTAH LAW

***Limit of One and a Half Inches
Set—Penalty Is Fine and
Jail Term.***

SALT LAKE CITY, Jan. 18.—The text of a bill to prohibit shoes with heels higher than one and a half inches in Utah was made public today at a meeting of representatives of women's clubs in conference with legislators at the Capitol.

The bill is so far reaching that a person found with a pair of such shoes in his possession is subject to a fine of from \$25 to \$500 for the first conviction and from \$500 to \$1,000 for every additional offense, and imprisonment of from thirty days to one year. It is drawn to take effect on and after Jan. 1, 1925.
