

KEEPS HER KNEES BARE IN ATLANTIC CITY JAIL

Authoress Holds Out for 'Constitutional Rights'—Policeman to Push Assault Charge.

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Sept. 4.—Miss Louise Rosine, who says she is a California authoress and 29 years old, is still in the Atlantic City jail, laboring under an added disadvantage besides that of being arrested for assaulting a beach policeman who insisted that she cover her bare knees. It appears that Miss Rosine has forgotten the number of her lodging place on Connecticut Avenue, so she is left with no other wardrobe than the bathing suit in which she was arrested.

From her cell in the city jail today Miss Rosine issued the statement that she still believed bare feminine knees to be allowed under the rights guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States.

The young woman used a blanket obtained for her by her jailer to sleep in last night, but went back to her bathing suit this morning and is still wearing her hose "rolled down" to show her knees.

Miss Rosine now faces a more serious charge than that of merely displaying bare knees on the beach in defiance of rules. Beach Policeman Shaw, who was given a lusty blow by the California writer for trying to tell her what she should wear in the line of knee covering, insists on pushing the charge of assaulting an officer on which she was technically jailed yesterday noon. Unless Miss Rosine can put up bail, it looks as though she would remain in her cell until Wednesday on the charge which will be heard before Magistrate Joseph Paxton.
