

PARIS BANS REFUGEE FILM

Curb on Sympathy for Loyalists Is Believed Cabinet's Aim

LONDON, Jan. 25.—The March of Time film, "The Refugee Today and Tomorrow," which is now showing in 1,100 theatres throughout Britain, has been banned in France, it is believed on orders of Foreign Minister Georges Bonnet.

Richard De Rochemont, European manager for The March of Time, said tonight that the French authorities had made an attempt to delete portions of the film but had notified him it could not be shown in France. It deals with refugees from China and Spain and especially from Germany and makes several references to Chancellor Adolf Hitler.

Mr. De Rochemont said he believed the ban was connected with the war in Spain. He believes the French Government does not want to increase popular sympathy with refugees from Barcelona.

The film is being shown in Britain without alterations.
