Only five new films are scheduled to open in local houses this week. They are:

Wednesday—"A Night at Earl Carroll's," with Ken Murray, Rose Hobart and J. Carroll Naish, at Loew's Criterion.

Thursday—"Tall, Dark and Handsome," with Cesar Romero and Milton Berle, at the Roxy; "Pride of the Bowery," with the East Side Kids, at the Rialto; "Let's Make Music," with Bob Crosby and Jean Rogers, at the Palace.

Friday — "High Sierra," with Humphrey Bogart and Ida Lupino, at the Strand.

The latest March of Time release, "Uncle Sam—the Non-Belligerent," will be added to the program at the Radio City Music Hall today. This is the film from which Senator Burton K. Wheeler demanded that his picture be removed last week. The request was denied by Louis de Rochemont, producer of the March of Time. Also in the release are scenes of the Nazi occupation of France taken from official German Army films.

There will be a special showing of "They Met on Skis" at the Fifty-fifth Street Playhouse this evening for the benefit of the Scottish Clans Evacuation Plan. Jan Struther, the writer, and Henry Sokal, the director and producer, will be guests of honor.
